MARY & THE ROSARY

MATTHEW 28:16-20

Taken from Luke's Gospel: The Annunciation & The Visitation

The Angel Gabriel appeared, and said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women!" but Mary was confused, and wondered why the Angel would greet her in this way. He said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for God is so pleased with you. You will become pregnant, give birth to a Son, and call him Jesus. He will be great, they will call him the Son of the Most High, and his kingdom will have no end." After the Angel left, Mary rushed to the home of her cousin, Elizabeth, who was also pregnant. When Elizabeth heard Mary arrive, she felt her baby leap and she was filled with joy. Elizabeth cried out, "Blessed are you, among women! And blessed is the fruit of your womb! And blessed is she who believed that the things promised to her by God will happen."

Every October, Catholics across the world focus especially on Mary. The prayer we say to her, the Hail Mary, is a source of comfort for billions of people.

The Rosary is a repetitive prayer, in total you say 50 Hail Mary's, 6 Our Father's, 6 Glory Be's, reflect on the Bible, and some more prayers!!! Using Rosary beads helps keep track of where you're up to. It sounds a lot - but usually only takes around 15 minutes. The Rosary is a wonderful way to grow closer to Mary our Mother. The repetition is comforting, and saying the words so many times helps you focus on the meaning. Some good advice is to just start by saying 1 Hail Mary, then just say 1 more... and 1 more!
